

Santa Cruz County Business Council Elects New Officers for 2014

FREEDOM (December 31, 2013) - Peggy Dolgenos, president of Santa Cruz-based Cruzio Internet, has been elected by the Santa Cruz County Business Council's (SCCBC) Board of Directors as Chair for a one-year term beginning January 2014 through December 2014. Ms. Dolgenos previously served as Vice Chair of SCCBC in 2013, while also maintaining an active role in the organization's government affairs and infrastructure committees.

As president of Cruzio Internet, Ms. Dolgenos oversees one of the largest independent Internet service providers in California. Cruzio recently introduced previously unavailable enterprise-level Internet services to Santa Cruz County, representing a huge investment in the community. Mr. Machado has served in a variety of leadership positions within SCCBC, including Co-Chair of the Board from 2008-2009. He currently serves as a consultant to a number of local organizations.
